Community Grant Guidelines

DEADLINE: JUNE 30th OF ANY GIVEN YEAR

- Only qualified donees* in Manitoba are eligible for grants from the Jewish Foundation of Manitoba;
- Projects must benefit the general community in Manitoba;
- Pilot projects must provide a plan for future funding beyond the pilot stage;
- Organizations that qualify for a Community Grant must complete their current grant before being able to apply for their next grant;
- JFM reserves the right to refer appropriate applications to the Women's Endowment Fund should it be a better fit.

Preference is given to projects which...

- ...Address community priorities and issues;
- ...Encourage more efficient use of community resources;
- ...Strengthen internal management capabilities of the applicant;
- ...Promote volunteer participation and citizen involvement;
- ...Demonstrate innovative approaches and techniques to resolve community problems.

Grants are not made for...

- ...Costs occurring prior to notification of grant approval;
- ...Fund-raising appeals such as memberships and sponsorships;
- ...Ongoing operations of an organization; including salaries & administrative costs
- ...Existing programs.

Performing Arts Opportunities: In respect to arts organizations only

Performing Arts organizations projects (plays, opera, art exhibitions, symphonies, and ballets) are considered operating projects as it is the mandate of these organizations to produce art. Grant applications will be accepted for these operating projects providing the project has Judaic content and/or special significance to the community at large.
